## Lingway launches the release 3.2 of Lingway KM

Paris, November 22<sup>th</sup> 2004 - Lingway, editor of document management software based on language engineering, today announced the availability of Lingway KM 3.2, its upgraded version providing a multilingual semantic search engine for query, categorization and reading assistance, dedicated to knowledge management and to applications of text mining and information watch.

**Lingway KM 3.2** upgrades include several features and especially a new module to develop applications for information watch:

\* The information watch module : provides a powerful data acquisition engine ("Web crawler") compatible with all current formats (Office, html, pdf, ...) and with RSS threads, as well as a customizable management tool to deal with users and alert messages (management of users' identifications and rights, of alert descriptions related to a specific user or to a group of users).

\* The upgraded linguistic analysis features are:

- Standardization of the generated meta-data (the synonymous extracted terms such as "government action" and "public action" are automatically gathered).
- Simplified user's dictionary (enabling to add easily simple or compound words and to modify the semantic network with an immediate update of the system).
- De-synchronization of indexation and extraction (a fast « full text » indexation is first carried out to manage warning messages and linguistic analysis (extraction of named entities and defining terms) is launched in asynchronous mode, as background task).
- Extension of recognition functions related to named entities (recognition of person's job and of legal type of a company).
- Improvement of generic dictionaries (in each version thousands of new terms are added, especially in products and services description and in tax system sector).
